 <b>BIG IDEA</b>	The more we discover of Creation, the more we should be in awe of the Creator.
 <b>ICE BREAKER</b>	Think back to a time when you were completely awestruck by nature (like seeing the stars on a clear night, witnessing a spectacular sunset, or standing at the edge of the Grand Canyon). Share your experience with the group and how it made you feel.
 <b>MAIN POINTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● God Speaks Through Creation. The universe declares God's glory without words.</li> <li>● Scientific discoveries reveal the intricate design of creation.</li> <li>● God Speaks Through Revelation. The Bible provides direction and purpose.</li> <li>● Scripture is described as perfect, trustworthy, right, and radiant.</li> <li>● Our Response to God Should Be Wonder and Worship.</li> </ul>
 <b>DISCUSS</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. What scientific fact about creation (mentioned in the sermon or otherwise) most amazes you about God's design? Why?</li> <li>2. How has modern technology and scientific discovery affected your view of God? Has it strengthened or challenged your faith?</li> <li>3. In what ways do we sometimes take God's creation for granted? How can we cultivate a greater sense of wonder?</li> <li>4. Pastor Cal mentioned that God's Word is like a compass and rudder for our lives. Share a time when Scripture provided clear direction for you.</li> <li>5. Why do you think David compared God's Word to gold and honey? What makes Scripture precious to you personally?</li> <li>6. How can we maintain a sense of awe and appreciation for Scripture when it's so readily available to us?</li> </ol>
 <b>NEXT STEP</b>	Where have you taken things "for granted" versus taking them "with gratitude"? Name a few ways you can shift to gratitude this week.
 <b>SCRIPTURE</b>	<p>Psalm 19:1-4 The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge. They have no speech, they use no words; no sound is heard from them. Yet their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world.</p> <p>Psalm 19:14 May these words of my mouth and this meditation of my heart be pleasing in your sight, Lord, my Rock and my Redeemer.</p>
